ISAIAH convention: Organizing for February caucuses

ISAIAH, a statewide multiracial group fighting for racial and economic justice in Minnesota, is holding a convention 11 a.m. to 6 p.m. Saturday, Dec. 13, at the Minneapolis Convention Center.

The goal is to bring people together to ratify a shared agenda to organize around for caucuses on February 3. Priorities include

- Childcare: Affordability and higher wages/benefits for workers
- Health Care: Path to universal care and defense of existing programs, including mental health and addiction treatment
- Youth Programming: Public, local, accessible, affordable, and culturally relevant
- Family Care / Elder Care
- · Climate: Resilience and

- adaptation; polluter accountability; safe, affordable housing; and energy affordability
- Housing: MHRC Bill of Rights, no-interest loans, "Yes to Homes" abundance framework, and antidiscrimination protections
- Family Affordability: Food assistance, child tax credit expansion, energy assistance, free college, and related supports
- Protecting Civil Rights:
 Addressing ICE and military
 presence in cities; defending free
 speech; supporting the right to
 divest from corporations that fund
 or enable human rights abuses
